

As well as identifying the relevant positions that exist, we have outlined the key responsibilities within each role, a rough salary guide and offered a comparison against other sporting organisations.

Building on our previous salary surveys, this benchmarking report has been based upon extensive research working on a variety of roles and through the candidate network we've established. As you will see, there is often a high degree of variance in salary ranges which is often accounted for by several key factors such as geography, commercial size of the club/organisation and the influx of talent from outside of the sports industry which has seen salary levels rise over the past few years. We have done our best to provide some sense as to the range of salary expectations; there will always be outliers, and the wide range gives a sense as to the reality of this.

Manager/ First Team Coach Benchmarking



Premier League Manager

Areas of responsibility

- Managerial Changes: There has been significant turnover among high-profile clubs. Jurgen Klopp, long the figurehead of Liverpool, left after 8 and a half years and was replaced by Arne Slot. Similarly, Mauricio Pochettino left Chelsea and was succeeded by Enzo Maresca, while Brighton appointed Fabian Hurzeler, making him the youngest manager in Premier League history at 31 years old. Notably, David Moyes and Roberto De Zerbi also departed their clubs.
- Managerial Stability: A contrasting trend to the previous season is the relative stability in the number of sackings. Only three managers were dismissed in 2023-24, compared to 14 in the 2022-23 season, suggesting clubs are giving managers more time to implement their philosophies.
- Young and Ambitious Managers: There
 is a rise in young, dynamic managers,
 such as Hurzeler and Enzo Maresca,
 aiming to bring innovative tactics to the
 league. Many of these new appointments
 favour attacking and possession-based
 football, reflecting a tactical shift among
 teams looking for fresh approaches.
- International: 75% of Managers and, around 66.7% of players in the English Premier League are from countries outside the UK. Still at a lower % clubs are hiring globally to ensure access to the best expertise. This has brought challenges, such as managing language barriers and differing medical practices, especially when dealing with players' home-country doctors.

Sports Medicine & Performance Benchmarking



• Technical Director/Director of Football

Areas of responsibility

- Oversee football philosophy
- Liaison between board/ownership and coaching staff
- Responsible for the hiring and mentoring coaches
- Budget management related to player acquisitions, wages, and other technical aspects.
- Crisis management. Deal with any technical or performance issues
- Oversee the club's academy, ensuring it is aligned with the first team's objectives and philosophy.

- · Recruitment and scouting lead
- Implement and oversee player development programs
- Develop and execute the club's transfer policy
- Use data and analytics to improve player performance, scout talent, and make informed decisions about recruitment and tactics.
- Innovation and strategy

Group Head of Performance

Areas of responsibility

- Global Head: Oversees the club's performance strategy globally and ensures all players and staff are aligned across all teams.
- Collaborates with Medical Teams: Works closely with sports scientists, physiotherapists, and medical staff to integrate injury prevention and recovery protocols through the Performance Director.
- Focus on High-Performance Culture:
 Cultivates a culture of excellence within the club, promoting continual improvement and high standards in all aspects of player preparation and recovery
- Reporting Line: Position usually reports to the Technical Director and/or Board.

- Performance Leadership: Leads initiatives to enhance player development, using data-driven and innovative approaches.
- Long-Term Strategy: Involved in longterm planning for improving performance across all levels of the club's operations, from the academy to the first team.
- CPD: Continued Professional Development (CPD) of Staff

Areas of responsibility

- Management of the Sports Medicine & Sports Science Team
- Overall clinical responsibility for the health of players
- Overall responsibility for the athletic development of the players
- The appointment and supervision of the medical and science team
- Oversee injury prevention strategies

- Manage departmental budgets
- Liaise with football management and senior management staff
- Continued Professional Development (CPD) of Staff
- Position reports either to the Team Manager, Technical Director or Board.

Head of Medical Services

Areas of responsibility

- Management of the Sports Medicine & broader Sports Science Team
- Overall clinical responsibility for the health of players
- Overall responsibility for the athletic development of the players
- The appointment and supervision of the medical and science team
- Oversee injury prevention strategies

- Manage departmental budgets
- Liaise with football management and senior management staff
- Continued Professional Development (CPD) of Staff
- Position reports either to the Team Manager, Technical Director or Board

Most clubs or teams that appoint a Head of Sports Medicine and Sports Science will not appoint for the separate positions of Head of Sports Medicine or Head of Sports Science, respectively.



Head of Sports Medicine (Doctor)

Areas of responsibility

- Overall clinical responsibility for the health of players
- Involvement in the appointment & supervision of the medical team
- Oversee injury prevention strategies
- Manage department budgets

- Liaise with football management and senior management staff
- Continued Professional Development of Staff (CPD)
- Position reports either to the Team Manager, Technical Director or Board

Example salary levels

| National Team | Also covers 4 European salary bands | £250k - £550k |

The employment of a doctor as Head of Sports Medicine is the most common scenario in global football. This is often based on the common view that doctors hold higher status than physiotherapists in medical hierarchies.



Head of Sports Medicine (Physiotherapist)

Areas of responsibility

- Overall clinical responsibility for the health of players
- Involvement in the appointment & supervision of the medical team
- Oversee injury prevention strategies
- Manage department budgets

- Liaise with football management and senior management staff
- Continued Professional Development of Staff (CPD)
- Position reports either to the Team Manager, Technical Director or Board.

Example salary levels

Many Premier League clubs have appointed a physiotherapist as their Head of Sports Medicine. This allows the club doctor to maintain match day responsibilities in the best interest of players' health.



• Head of Sports Science and Strength & Conditioning

Areas of responsibility

- Responsible for the protocols and processes of all Sports Science and Fitness staff
- Develop injury prevention strategies in line with medical staff
- Manage training facilities and equipment
- Overall responsibility for the physical fitness of players
- Liaise with senior coaches regarding all aspects of Sports Science
- Control all aspects of player fitness, strength and overall conditioning
- Position usually reports Head of Medical Services.

| National Team | Position can often be taken up on a part time basis. | £150k - £250k |

Often reporting to the Head of Sports Medicine & Sports Science, this position holds closer ties to management and coaching staff. As such, professionals in this role regularly move during managerial change.



Club Doctor / First Team Doctor

Areas of responsibility

- Overall responsibility for all medical treatments required by players
- Work alongside physiotherapists & provide medical expertise in the management of all injuries
- Be involved in the design & implementation of all injury rehabilitation programs
- Attend all match days to work alongside the head of department
- Responsibility for the safety & welfare of injured playing staff (long & short term)
- Co-ordinate the role of external health consultants utilised by the club or players
- Organise and attend to pre-signing medical protocols as required
- Position usually reports Head of Medical Services or the Team Manager.

| Centre of Excellence (Medical or Science) | Role more highly valued in dedicated centres and extends further than one member of staff | £200k - £450k |
| National Team | Position can often be taken up on a part time basis. | £200k - £350k |

Club and First Team Doctors are now preferred to have Sports Medicine specialisation. Salaries are reflective of the skill set, qualifications and experience held.



First Team Physiotherapist

Areas of responsibility

- Assist with the design and implementation of injury rehabilitation programs
- Liaise with football management, head of department and other staff members to optimise player performance
- Position usually reports Head of Medical Services or the Team Manager
- Attend pre-signing medical protocols as required
- Assist with the design and implementation of injury rehabilitation programs
- Liaise with football management, head of department and other staff members to optimise player performance
- Position usually reports Head of Medical Services or the Team Manager

Example salary levels

| Premiership Football Club | Range attributable to lead physiotherapists and assistant physiotherapists | £90k - £300k |

| National Team | Mainly hired as head of medical department (see Head of Sports Medicine) | £90k - £250k |

Most clubs will have more than one physiotherapist, with one member of the physical therapies team taking up an unofficial role of 'Head of Physical Therapies'. As such, a variation in salary range can be expected.



• First Team Sports Scientist

Areas of responsibility

- Collection of various indices & sports science data
- Overall responsibility for the analysis and presentation of all sports science data
- Physiological assessment of players
- Planning of strategies to pass on to the Fitness Coach and Strength & Rehabilitation Coach
- Supervision of post training and standalone recovery sessions
- Liaison with Fitness & Conditioning staff and the Head of Department

Example salary levels

| Championship Football Club | More of a junior role. Graduate or PhD | £30k - £70k |
| Centre of Excellence (Medical or Science) | Often more than on position. Significant field experience with a solid research base | £70k - £150k |
| National Team | Usually Part time, academic partnerships | £70k - £150k |

Most clubs will have more than one sport scientist with responsibilities including data monitoring, management responsibility of sports science students (MSc or Undergraduate), physiological assessments, match analysis and opposition analysis.



Academy Sports Medicine & Sports Science Benchmarking



Head of Sports Medicine (Academy)

Areas of responsibility

- Overall clinical responsibility for the health of Academy players
- Supervision of the Academy medical team
- Oversee injury prevention strategies in the Academy
- Manage department budgets

- Liaise with football management and senior management staff
- Liaise with Senior team staff on a regular basis
- Continued Professional Development of Staff (CPD)

Example salary levels

| Level | Comments | Salary range |

| Premiership Football Club | Relatively new role within the industry | £70k - £190k |
| Championship Football Club | Rare role within the Championship | N/A |
| Centre of Excellence (Medical or Science) | N/A | N/A |
| National Team | More often this role is taken up by a number of part time staff members across U17, U19 and U21 levels. | £70k - £180K |

This role is often recruited from within and existing staff on relatively low wages assume greater responsibility but with little change in their base salary.



Head of Sports Science & Strength & Conditioning (Academy)

Areas of responsibility

- Responsible for the protocols and processes of Academy Sports Science & Fitness staff
- Develop injury prevention strategies in line with medical staff
- Manage training facilities and equipment

- Responsibility for the physical fitness of Academy players
- Liaise with coaches regarding Sports Science
- Control all aspects of player fitness, strength and overall conditioning

This position traditionally combines the roles of a Head Sport Scientist and a Lead Strength & Conditioning Coach.



Academy Physiotherapist

Areas of responsibility

- Assessment & treatment of Musculo-skeletal injuries
- Initial diagnosis of injury
- Assist with the design & implementation of player screenings
- Assist with the design and implementation of injury rehabilitation programs
- Liaise with football management, head of department and other staff members
- _

| Championship Football Club | Mainly combined with roles with the First Team | £20k - £35k |

| National Team | Mainly hired on a part time basis | £20k - £30k |

Physiotherapists will often take these positions in the hope of defining a career path to first-team football, they often go above and beyond the call of duty to make a difference.



Academy Sports Scientist

Areas of responsibility

- Collection of various indices & sports science data
- Analysis and presentation of sports science data
- Physiological assessment of players with Senior & First Team staff
- Strategies to pass on to the Fitness Coach and Strength & Rehabilitation Coach
- Liaison with Fitness & Conditioning staff and the Head of Department.

Example salary levels

| Level | Comments | Salary range |
|---|--|--------------|
| Premiership Football Club | Often held by recent Sports Science graduates who have excelled in internship roles. Viewed as a 'stepping stone' to First Team roles. | £20k - £50k |
| Championship Football Club | Rare position within Championship clubs. Often held by recent Sports Science graduates whose services have been maintained | £20k - £35k |
| Centre of Excellence (Medical or Science) | Not relevant position | N/A |
| National Team | Mainly hired on a part time basis | £20k - £40k |

Whilst not earning high salaries, these positions are often filled by the next breed of Sports Science 'talent'. Positions in this area are taken up on a full time basis, making sacrifices for a period of at least three years to move into First Team positions.
